


Fig 1: Nurse/ midwife's knowledge regarding effective communications (yes answers)




Fig 3: Nurse/ midwife's practices toward effective communications (always answers)




Fig 5: Scatter plots of knowledge, attitudes, practice, and barriers of communication with each other in nurses and midwives
